Equine Therapy Program -From the Horse's Mouth

Located in Bayswater North, From the Horse's Mouth (FTHM), is a FREE four-week introductory program developed specifically enhance Veteran wellbeing incorporating equine assisted learning through meaningful experiences, in a support group environment. It is provided by a collaborative community effort through a consortium of organisations; Ringwood RSL, Equestique Horse Riding and Bright Community Services. This utilizes the existing experience and



expertise of many for the benefit of the veteran community.

FTHM promotes veteran mental health and wellbeing using the principles of groundwork with horses to bundle skills and manage mental health. The program creates an environment for Veterans to receive peer support, learn horsemanship skills, develop new life skills to manage depression and anxiety, increase social connections and provide referrals for veterans to other helpful ongoing community services. The property is easily accessible via public transport with a bus stop directly out the front of the property.

Delivered Fridays 10-12:30, over four weeks. We are now receiving expressions of interest for the April and May groups.
