FROM THE PRESIDENTS PEN





Looking Back at 2023

Last year could be characterised as a 'steady as you go' period. We maintained our range of programs designed to help veterans in our local area and our members we also conducted the ANZAC and Remembrance Day services for the Ringwood community. Each of these events was well supported although attendance on the 11th November was somewhat less than for previous years.

Again, I am pleased to be able to report that our trading position has continued to be strong and we end the year with a healthy surplus. We are using the trading surpluses to build a fund firstly to cope with the uncertainties ahead particularly with regards to our proposed redevelopment and secondly to ensure we are able to fit out a new facility when it is built.

The Sub Branch conducts many regular activities for the benefit of veterans, their families and our members to provide support for those who need it, to enhance socialisation and to give assistance to those who need to make claims for support from the Department of Veteran Affairs. One such, is the Friday Night Board Games which is open to all. Another is the Veterans Fitness Engagement program which is conducted by Jason Isaac every Wednesday night and revolves around a 'boxercise" circuit to promote fitness and encourage friendship connections for veterans, our members and their families as well as the community. A new program which started in 2023 is the 'From the Horse's Mouth' equine therapy program conducted by one of our chaplains. This targets more recent veterans to help them manage and overcome emotional and stress related issues. Details of all our programs are available from reception.

We are well served by our Pension Office personnel led by Kevan Andrews and our Welfare Coordinator Lyn Maestri and our Chaplains. They've continued to provide welfare and pension advocacy support to veterans and their families throughout the year.

In September 2023 we entered a team in the veterans' games which is an exciting initiative targeting in particular, our more recent veterans. This carnival of sport was the inaugural launch of an annual event designed to celebrate and showcase the skills and excellence of our Veteran Community. Our team the 'Average Joes' did well, and were voted the 'most popular' team by the crowd of supporters at the games. One of the most pleasing aspects of this initiative from my point of view, is the way the team and its supporters have built an ongoing social media based friendship and support network.

The redevelopment project (Project 2022 & Beyond) is progressing albeit not at the speed we would like. It achieved two major milestones in 2023, first the submission of the planning application to the Maroondah City Council and secondly the agreement in principle between the developer and a purchaser for all the residential units in the planned complex. The purchaser is an independent living provider with over 9,000 residents, across 58 communities at present. There are still some serious hurdles to overcome before planning approval will be granted but our project team in conjunction with the developer, has engaged with both the Maroondah City Council and the State Government to help with moving the project forward.

Looking Forward

The Royal Commission into Veteran Suicides will be completing its work and reporting to the Government. The RSL made a submission to it as did I and the veteran community is looking forward to reading its findings and in particular its recommendations. We can only hope that unlike the numerous previous inquiry reports, there will be positive actions from the Federal Government that will enhance support to veterans and their families.

We will again enter a team for this year's Veteran Games as well as encouraging other sub branches in our area to jointly sponsor another team.

Further equine therapy programs will be conducted through the year and I urge any of you or if you know someone who would benefit from these to please contact reception for details.

We are hopeful that the matter of the planning application will be resolved this year so the project can move to its next (construction) phase.

The Committee and Manager are planning entertainment and other events for our members and are always open to suggestions from members to expand the range and nature of programs and events for the benefit of the veteran community and our members.

A Final Word

Yet again I am grateful for the loyalty and work of our volunteers including those involved with the ANZAC & Poppy Appeals, Women's Auxiliary, War Widows and the Friday Club, our Chaplains Cheryl & Tristan Forrest and very much look forward to seeing them being able to help with the work of the Sub Branch in 2024.

We are well served by the Sub Branch Club Manager and his staff and thank them for their professionalism and commitment in conducting the commercial operations of the Sub Branch.

The Committee and I are enormously grateful for the understanding shown by and the support from our members.

Thank you all for your support and keep well in 2024.

Support to Veterans and the Community

Sub Branch Veteran & Community Support

The main welfare and support work of the Sub Branch is outlined here:

• During 2023 we helped many veterans in the Eastern Metropolitan Region of Melbourne. Our pension advocates provided assistance with their claims for support from the Department of Veterans' Affairs. This is a highly valued service at the core of our objectives as an RSL Sub Branch. The Welfare Coordinator and her team of volunteers provided much needed welfare and practical support to veterans in our region as well as to the older and less mobile members of the Sub Branch. These volunteer services included in-home and hospital support, welfare help, transport assistance, mobility aids as well as minor house and garden maintenance etc. These services have a particular value for our frailer members but also for others in our community who need our help. This volunteer support to the Maroondah community was costed out at \$70,195.

- We conducted commemorative services for the Ringwood community to mark ANZAC and Remembrance Days at the Ringwood Clock Tower Memorial Park.
- We conducted our normal remembrance services with local football teams spread from Mitcham to East Ringwood.
- We were able to provide bursaries and assistance worth \$3,000 for children attending Ringwood, Heathmont and Norwood Secondary Colleges.
- We supported the Maroondah Brass and the Ringwood Pipe Bands with cash sponsorship totalling \$8,000 to help them meet their costs of providing musical support to the Sub Branch and the wider community. These bands continue to provide a valued component of our commemoration services.
- We provided support to members of the Sub Branch with subsidised meals and refreshments, and other "in club" activities designed to combat social isolation and enhance camaraderie among veterans and their families. The cost for these was approximately \$317,979.
- We ran the Welfare/Courtesy Bus for members benefit as part of our social inclusion program at a cost of \$73,042.
- We provided sponsorship of and support for the Women's Auxiliary, War Widows, the Day Club and Sub Branch Sporting Sub Sections worth \$61,125.
- Sponsorship to the Ringwood Football/Netball Club, Heathmont Football Club, Our Ladies Netball Club and Ainsley Park Cricket Club was provided at a cost of \$16,730.
- We provide the use of our facilities provided for local community groups at a cost of \$38,700.
- We contributed to the local community with employment of 50 staff from the surrounding community \$2,219,583.
- We contributed \$139,976 to the State Branch to help fund its work coordinating and providing services to the Victorian veteran community and to assist smaller Victorian sub branches

In total we contributed some \$2,948,330 worth of benefits to our veterans and community in 2023.

SUB BRANCH PROGRAMS & SERVICES

Veteran Fitness Engagement

The VFE is designed to promote connection through exercise and conversation with the modern-day veteran, families and friends at Ringwood RSL.

Our aim is to create an engaging environment in a space that's familiar with the model of camaraderie within the ADF and create lasting friendships for a life after service.

The program is open to veterans, their family members, RSL members, police, first responders and the local community.

Connection is the key to conversation, being available as a mate to spend time in a mutual activity, sharing a meal afterwards to unwind and allow people to relax and enjoy their evening with a sense of achievement and connection scheduled for Wednesday nights 1830-1930hrs.

Wellbeing & Pension Service - Oasis Support Centre

The Oasis Support Centre Ringwood is a service of the Ringwood RSL Sub Branch and provides Welfare and Pension support services to serving and former members of the Australian Defence Force (ADF), their families & the wider community.

The office is open Tuesdays, Wednesdays & Thursdays from 9am- 5pm with the Pension advocates available on Thursdays.

Our Wellbeing Services Coordinator is professionally qualified to assist current ADF Service, our Service Members, Veterans & Community members.

Assistance is provided via appropriate referral to support agencies including:

Home & Community Care	Transportation
Healthy Eating & Access to Meals	Occupational Therapy
Wellbeing Services	Bereavement, Funerals/Eulogies
Counselling	Legal Aid

The Wellbeing Support Office also provides support through phone calls & visits to Aged Care Facilities, Homes & Hospitals.

Our Pension Officers are available on premises Thursdays to provide support services to serving and former members of the Australian Defence Force (ADF) and their families. Appointments outside these hours can be made by phoning Reception.

Equine Therapy Programme (From the Horse's Mouth)

This program consisting of four sessions is run over a month and is designed to help in particular veterans and their families better manage stress, their mental and emotional health. It is conducted by Cheryl Forrest one of our Chaplains at a property on Bayswater Road Croydon. It is open to veterans and their immediate families.

WELFARE AND COMMUNITY SUPPORT

The welfare office continues to assist members and veterans and has had over a hundred enquiries with several diverse queries where many referrals have been made to varied services, required by these members.

I encourage members and veterans over the age of 65 that need any assistance to register with My Aged Care If you need some help the My Aged Care team can support you over the phone. 1800 400 422.

Our fantastic pension advocates, Kevan, Ian, Emily and Heather who assists with the admin, have been kept busy with appointments on Thursdays. I would like to say a big thank you to them for volunteering and dedicating their time in assisting our Veterans. Congratulations to Kevan on 10 Years as an advocate with the RSL in June.

Our wellbeing groups continue with the Strength and Mobility Class, Bingo, Friendly Fridays and now this year a small craft group every second Tuesday afternoon. There is also a free boxing class held on Wednesday evenings. We would like to start up a new social and wellbeing activity group this year and it appears by the survey results people would like to see trivia and games possibly one afternoon a week. If you are interested in participating in any of these groups, please don't hesitate to enquire.

We are always looking for volunteers to assist with our appeals, Anzac appeal in April and Poppy appeal in November. Without these wonderful Volunteers selling badges during the appeals our funds will diminish and this will make it difficult to assist our veterans.

The current volunteers always comment on how much satisfaction they get out of selling badges out in the Community. If you can spare any time, even just a couple of hours please come and see me to register your availability.

We receive many requests from families, to help with eulogies for funerals of deceased veterans and conduct the RSL component of the service. Thanks to Margaret, our funeral officer, we can assist these families at their loved one's funerals. Margaret also conducts presentations in Aged Care facilities for Anzac Day and Remembrance Day to celebrate these important events. If anyone else would like to assist in this, please come and have a chat as Margaret gets very busy at appeal time.

Again, last Christmas we have put together some fantastic care bags for the more vulnerable members of the club, these were very well received.

Volunteers continue to provide support to the needs of others, to the RSL community and the selling of the badges and poppies, we thank all that our volunteers do for us.

TREASURERS REPORT 2022

It is with great pleasure that I provide this report for the financial year ending 31st December 2023. The report is based on the final audited figures, copies of which are provided at the Annual General Meeting.

This financial year came off the back of the 2022 financial year which was a record year for our club bouncing back after the COVID years. Taking this into account I am pleased to report to you that, for the financial year ending 31st December 2023, our club made a net profit of \$508,823.

This is a very pleasing outcome, and, in my opinion is a result of the great efforts put in our management and staff during the year. It is also a reflection on you, our members, for supporting the club and making such a great place to be involved with.

There are a few items that I would like to focus on:

- 1) The committee decided to transfer an amount of \$300,000 from its profit to a Redevelopment Reserve. This in essence left the club with Total Comprehensive Income for the year of \$208,823.
- 2) Sales revenue in bar +7% and food +10.7% were up against 2022 but the fact that gaming was down (13.3%) meant that total sales revenue was down (1.4%) against the 2022 financial year.
- 3) Cash on hand at sitting at a healthy \$1.6 million at the end of December 2023.
- 4) Loan to the Building Fund was \$2.944 million as at the end of December 2023.
- 5) After having purchased our floor stock of poker machines in 2022, we undertook a major capital upgrade in 2023 of new EGM's and Game changes spending \$310,750. With this capital investment our club has one of the most modern and attractive floors in our area.
- 6) Cost Of Goods Sold were below 2022 levels.
- 7) Our State Branch contribution was around \$140,000.
- 8) Rent to Patriotic Building Fund \$150,970.
- 9) During the year we set up an offset account with the ANZ bank to reduce the interest paid on our loan.

Looking forward to 2024 I feel confident that the club will continue to remain in a strong financial position.

I would personally like to acknowledge the good work done by the management and staff of the Ringwood RSL Sub Branch and I'd like to thank our General Manager, Wayne Chisholm, and our accounts staff for the support they have given me in performing my role as treasurer. I would also like to thank the committee and you, our members of this club, for what you do to make this a great club.

Looking forward to working with you all again in 2024.

DEVELOPMENT REPORT

I have recently been asked by several members if the redevelopment project is actually going ahead. The answer is an emphatic YES!

As the members were informed last year: "We are in the phase of the project where we need to apply for the relevant permits and approvals to proceed. No physical action can be taken until those permits and approvals are obtained. Our development partners are working diligently on those and will continue to do so. The approval application process could take in excess of 12 months depending on the response of the Maroondah City Council to the application. We had planned on this time frame."

The Council has, to date, been varied in their response from being positive to being negative which makes the process more difficult. As a result, our development partners are exploring all potential avenues for expediting the approval process.

Our partners are also in currently in negotiations with a large residential owner/management company which has agreed in principle to purchase all the residential apartments and is presently conducting a due diligence analysis before fully committing to the purchase. This is a well-known and very large company in the independent living sector of the property industry. Due to ongoing negotiations with them, which are "commercial in confidence", the Committee is not in a position at this time to inform members of the identity of that organisation. As soon as any agreement is formalised, you will be advised of who they are.

If these negotiations are successful, the project will be ready to proceed as soon as the necessary approvals are granted.

The Committee is committed to the project with one over-riding condition. That the club receives the full outcomes, both in terms of financial benefits and club facilities, that are the basis of the existing development agreement.

The committee will keep members updated on significant developments as they occur.

Over recent years the Memorabilia Team has been focused on recording the Sub-Branch collection on the Victorian Collections Museums Victoria website. This work progressed at a slow pass in 2023, due to reduced volunteer numbers. As a team we have revised our collection protocols which will lead us to review all items currently held. This will be an emotional journey for those involved as we access items on quality, best of type, relevance, and future use for display.

Unfortunately, over time many items in the collection (particularly publications and uniforms) have deteriorated due to poor storage conditions. Available storage space and environment will play a role in what is retained.

During 2023 the Committee endorsed a decision with immediate effect not to accept memorabilia donations until further notice. The only exemption to be sets of original campaign/service medals.

Visitors to the Sub-Branch will know that our prominent memorabilia on display reflects service during WW1, WW11 and Vietnam. We have little associated with contemporary Veterans post 1992.

During the year 2 framed pieces below were purchased to address this.

With the proposed redevelopment of the Sub-Branch nearing an important point in the planning approval process the Teams focus for 2024 will be the critical review all items held both on display and stored in the memorabilia cage in the basement.

Current planning is for memorabilia items agreed to be retained by the Sub-Branch to be moved to appropriate storage off site during construction phase of the redevelopment.

OASIS VETERAN & FAMILY SUPPORT CENTRE

Hello from the military advocacy team. Our team of advocates have worked very hard to assist the veteran community and the club. Many of you may not have seen us as we dwell in the bowels of the club in a place called the Dungeon. Our team consists of Kevan Andrews, Ian Richards, Heather Andrews (Administration Officer) and Emily Gard, our apprentice advocate. We are all volunteers. In June 2024, Kevan will have been an advocate at the RSL for 10 years.

During 2023 we welcomed Emily Gard to the team, and she is currently undertaking her Level 1 training, under the mentorship of Kevan Andrews, to become a Military Advocate. Ian Richards has been continuing his Level 2 training during 2023.

Of the DVA outcomes the advocates achieved the following: $1 \times TPI$, $1 \times 100\%$; $1 \times War Widow$, $1 \times Service Pension and many individual claims such as cancer non-liability claims and claims for the white card. When we talk about claims some of our clients have up to <math>12$ or more claims and these can be under various Acts.

11 of the clients we interviewed will not be returning as the advocates are not able to assist them any further.

Our team has doubled the claims submitted in 2022. However, the number of outcomes has reduced due to the delay in DVA processing of claims which is now taking up to two years. This can take longer due to some of the complications of the claim or if the claims are under multiple Acts. We are still awaiting claims to be completed from 2021.

I would like to address the DVA Gold Health Card. Many of our veterans have a gold card issued for operational service in Vietnam. This gold card is not automatically passed onto your spouse/partner. Only Special Rate endorsed gold cards (that is TPI, TTI, EDA) are passed onto your spouse/partner in the form of a Widows pension. 
